An overnight star party is being organized by the community of Markleeville for the benefit of the community, ASN members, and guests. The date is Saturday night August 24. We will observe and camp at the Alpine County Airport (closed for the night) just north of Markleeville. The airport is 70 miles or 1.5 hours south of UNR.

The airport has open vistas, hard surface, and available camping near the telescope area. A pancake breakfast will be provided by the community.

Local planning for the Star Party on August 24 is well underway. We will have a toilet, and are organizing a food truck (BBQ), snacks, coffee and hot chocolate. Jim Fahey attended a visit to the site on June 27 to see where to park cars and set up the telescopes. Markleeville is also looking into getting liability insurance for 1 day. We want promote the event and encourage as many members as possible to attend. The more telescopes the better. We are expecting about 50 + local residents to attend.

The Markleeville, the Alpine County Seat, awaits ASN with its Historical complex with museum, library and county courthouse buildings. It is a step back in time.
